COIN OF THE MONTH

Guitar Coins from the Somali Republic

At our show, I had a YN show me one of the coins she had purchased with her show bucks. It was guitar coin with the US flag on it. She told me it was from Somalia. Having just spent a few days in Noel working with people from Somalia, I was intrigued and wanted to learn more. This is what I found out.

The multi-colored Guitar coins were minted in 2004 and are designed after famous electric guitars. They were issued to commemorate the 50th anniversary of Rock 'n Roll. The designs are the classic red and white Fender Stratocaster, an American Flag Stars and Stripes Gibson Flying V, a black Gibson Flying V, a pink guitar used by various rock stars including Gary Glitter and Abba, a blue Gibson X-Plorer and a yellow Klein. These six pieces are the original series. More may be coming later due to the popularity of them. These coins are 1 Dollar legal tender coins that were issued by the Somali Republic. They are approxi-

mately 1.75 inches long. They were issued in silver plate and the American Flag guitar in copper nickel.

The set of coins is below.

The picture on the right is the reverse. It is the same on each coin.
