PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGE

- C. Classes of members: There shall be three classes of membership.
 - Y.N. or Junior members: Persons under the age eighteen (18) shall be considered as Y.N. or junior club members. Y.N. or juniors shall have all the privileges of other members or adult members except the right to vote in club officer and director elections and the right to serve as an officer of the club. An exception may be authorized by the board or president for the Juniors to elect an upper level junior to be a representative from their group who has obtained the age of 15. This individual will have the right to vote on behalf of all juniors during all major elections. His or her vote will count the same as one senior member vote.

- **C.** Classes of members: There shall be three classes of membership.
 - Y.N. or Junior members: Persons <u>BETWEEN THE AGES OF SIX (6) AND THE AGE OF</u>
 <u>EIGHTEEN (18) SHALL BE CONSIDERED AS A Y.N. OR A JUNIOR MEMBER.</u> Y.N. or juniors shall have all the privileges of other members or adult members except the right to vote in club officer and director elections and the right to serve as an officer of the club.

An exception may be authorized by the board or president for the Juniors to elect an upper level junior to be a representative from their group who has obtained the age of 15. This individual will have the right to vote on behalf of all juniors during all major elections. His or her vote will count the same as one senior member vote.

DECEMBER IN MINT HISTORY



- December 1, 1874: The Mint delivers its first shipment of half dollars.
- December 8, 1921: First Peace dollars are struck.
- December 13, 1978: Philadelphia Mint begins production of the SBA dollar.
- December 14, 1899: The entire mintage of the Lafayette half dollar was struck.
- December 31, 1829: US Mint reports it has a stockpile of 900,000 half cents.
- December 31, 1873: The Carson City Mint strikes 5,000 \$20 gold coins.
